




### MATERIALS MATTER

So... why wood? With metal, you know what's inside. More metal.

With wood, you don't know what's inside. It's organic, non-manmade. It's a gamble (a beautiful one) each and every time we pick up a piece of raw wood. Timber is an artifact of nature that cannot be truly replicated. That's part of why Glacial Wood exists, because working with wood and meticulously refining the craft for three decades is a testament to our passion and stance as craftsmen.

The grain, the scent, the way sawdust acts like confetti, celebrating each vision and interpretation our customers have for their parts... all of it is why. Woodturning, engineering, and nature. The trifecta. Think of your senses, and how often you call upon them when designing. Erecting a large, sometimes ostentatious hotel can be visually stunning; yet creating an interior that shields guests from noise, cold, and the elements involves the rest of your senses. Wood uses all of ours. Cool vs. warm. Light vs. dark. The sound of footsteps on a marble floor. The way laughter reverberates off a wood-laden wall.



## **SIMPLIFY:** ELIMINATING THE UNNECESSARY

Our woodturners are renegades and free thinkers with limitless imaginations. Because they are not robots in a widget factory, pushing buttons and managing a standard assembly line, our team requires an environment that enables them to be renegades.

Lean has fostered that atmosphere, and granted our production team the ownership to be their best. Too often, complexity clouds judgment and poses as an intermediary for interest. Designers like yourself could pare down your parts and products to the essentials, so nothing clutters up your final product. If there is no function, it should be eliminated.

Glacial Wood operates very much by the same principle.

Our focus is always on the design, shape, form, and aesthetics of our woodturned and square parts; applying lean principles to this process has further strengthened that singular focus. While lean principles support building with less, we're still building with more at Glacial Wood. More time spent in production. More empowering of our team. More added value. More sustainability. Naturally, there is need for order. Lean principles grant a hierarchy which means we decide what's the most important, and let everything else defer to it.

### WAYS IN WHICH LEAN HAS BEEN APPLIED AT GLACIAL WOOD:

#### JUST-IN-TIME MANUFACTURING

In Glacial Wood's production model, parts are created to meet demand, instead of in surplus or in advance of need. This avoids the waste associated with overproduction. In addition to the waste of overproduction, there is six other types of waste lean principles work to eliminate.

#### **VALUE ADDING**

As customer requirements continue to shift, manufacturing companies respond with different production practices. Mass production of standard products used to be the method many industries forecasted, but it's clear this method resulted in excessive inventory, too much movement, and wasted resources in people, processes, and products. Glacial Wood focuses on quality through our small-lot, on demand-based production of customized parts. Our teammate-oriented approach empowers a team to take action and achieve improvements in a continuous, contiguous way. Any activity that doesn't add value to the form or function of the turned wood and square parts we manufacture is a non-value added entity. We employ lean principles to not only seek value added steps, but to eliminate waste.



More than just a buzzword, sustainability is a goal and an attainable one at that. During manufacturing we process our resources into parts with minimal negative environmental impact. Save motion. Save time. Save energy. Save money. The impact Glacial Wood has can be seen in our customers, craft, and community. 
